Your Excellency,

I take the liberty to apply to Your Excellency in the following matter:

From July 1940 until the end of June 1941 some thousands of inhabitants of the Northern Bucovina have been deported to Siberia and other parts of the Soviet Union. In most cases the indication for the deportation was the former occupation and profession of the persons in question, as land-owner, merchant, manufacturer, hadesman i.c.a profession by which he once had employed workers or employees.-

Apart from the fact that those people exercised their profession according to the economical order and system of the former state they lived in, it was even not entered into particulars, if the one or the other had exploited his employees cutting short their wages or other interests. The mere profession was sufficient reason to take away without further proceeding the persons concerned from their homes, with the permission to have about them 50 Kg. of baggage, and to send them of places thousands of kilometers away. For the most part their women and children were deported too together with them and under certain circumstances they were separated from each other.—

It happend too that the profession was not decisive for the arrestation but reasons, the particulars of which was not given to the public.

Much grief and harm pauperisation and privations in the worst forms were brought on thousends of families in Northern Bucovina at that time by these inexplicable measures. None of those deported because of their profession, have expressed neither in word nor in writing, opinions diverging from the communistic ideology or against the Soviet-regime. In spite of the fact that their material situation would have rendered possible an escape, respectively a settlement in another country, most of them preferred to remain on the place of their birth, trusting the justice of a New Order, which ought to give every man the claim to life and work.

They were determined to turn their back on a world full of fascist slogans and to incorporate themselves into the social structure of the Soviet-Union with all their abilities and knowledge.-

Many of the deported are no longer alive, from other all news are missing. The hard and cruel war imposed on the world by the Hitler regime has shown that those elements to which the deported belonged were anything but fascist and the Red Army on his victorious advance were hailed by them with great joy and enthusiasm as their deliberators.—

The remainder of all these families, scattered allover the world as well as those who remained the Northern Bucovina beg to apply to Your Excellency to intervene with the Soviet Government:

- I. That the victims of those above mentioned measures, as far as they are alive may be transported back to their homes,
- II. That the which returned should be given the possibility to get into contact with their families wereever they may live.

I have the honour to transmit a petition addressed to the High Commissioner by Dr. Elias Weinstein requesting intervention with the government of the U.S.S.R. in order to facilitate the return of certain inhabitants of the Northern Bukovina allegedly deported to Siberia by the Soviet authorities and in order to enable them after their return to communicate with their families.

- 2. Dr. Weinstein was resident until 1944 in Czernowitz, where he published the newspaper "Morgenblatt". He was a member of the Vaad Hapoel of the Zionist Organisation in Rumania up to the time of the German occupation of that country and entered Palestine in April 1944. Dr. Weinstein is at present administrative manager of the newspaper 'Hege'.
- 3. I am unable to recommend what action, if any, should be taken on Dr. Weinstein's representations.
